The Historic Athenaeum in Columbia, Tennessee, is all that remains of two famous girl schools that flourished in the area from the 1830s until the Great Depression. Built in 1837, the Athenaeum served as the rectory for these two schools and was occupied by the same family



1800s in what was then America's Western Frontier.

The James K. Polk Home is the only surviving residence of the 11th President of the United States (other than the White House). This beautifully preserved American landmark is home to one of the finest Presidential collections in the nation, as well as period artifacts and authentic glimpses of life in the early

Polk's presidency represents two remarkable stories: the story of his own unlikely rise from a sickly frontier youth to a powerful U.S. President, and the beginning of America's westward expansion. During Polk's single term, the United States grew from a coastal nation nestled between the Atlantic and the Appalachians to a continental country that reached the Pacific. *JamesKPolk.com*



Historic Rippavilla is located in the heart of Spring Hill, Tennessee and features a stunning and fully restored 1855 Greek Revival styled mansion, complete with original Cheairs family antiques, heirlooms and Civil War artifacts.

The grounds, which span 98 acres in Maury County, encompass the family and slave cemeteries, Freedmen's Bureau school house, slave quarters, and the Battlefield of Spring Hill (precursor to the famous Battle of Franklin). *Rippavilla.org*
