

Director's Note

Romeo & Juliet is arguably the most popular of Shakespeare's works, whether performed or read. Audiences continue to be captivated by this story of two star-crossed lovers. To bring this more than 400-year-old play closer to us, we found a similar long-standing family battle on American soil in the infamous Hatfield—McCoy feud. We are taking a few historical liberties, expanding roles for women.

In prepping for this production, one theme kept creeping into my mind: Division. The town of Verona is completely divided due to the feud between the Capulets and Montagues. This animosity is visceral and timeless. One cannot help but notice the parallels to the division felt in our current climate, around any number of issues. You name it, we fight about it.

Through his play, Shakespeare seems to say that two things can conquer this type of unrest: love and shared tragedy. But that is entertainment; real life is much more complicated. The divisions we experience in our present moment come from several sources, but we as individuals can make a conscious effort to combat them before we go through devastating tragedies. Just like the characters of *Romeo & Juliet*, we can choose to let go of the biases we hold, both in small ways and large, and learn to come together in love, understanding, and friendship.
