Jane Austen is known for her brilliant job blending satire and romance; for the beautiful poetry through her writing. I respect her so much because what most people don't realize is that Austen was a very strong woman who didn't live by social norms. And the women she wrote about are the same. *Sense and Sensibility* is known to be one of the best works in literary fiction. And these characters are still among us today, which is why it's so important to

continue producing material like this. The thing that I kept coming back to while reading/researching/directing this show is: An 18th-century heart beats in 2025. And it's true.

Yes, of course there's romance in this production — come on, it's a Jane Austen story — but the show REALLY centers around sisterhood. To me, the male lovers in this story are very important, but they serve to bring Elinor and Marianne Dashwood closer together; sisters who couldn't be any different, but who discover that the best parts of them will save each other. Kate Hamill's adaptation that you will see today is not your average Austen show; it will throw curveballs at you. And whether you're an Austen fan or not, I hope you'll be entertained.
