Director's Note

Much Ado About Nothing is the prototype for romantic comedies. Hallmark Christmas movies, wherein our heroine goes back to her home town and is annoyed by an old flame before eventually falling for him? When Harry Met Sally, where two flawed people banter and bicker before falling in love? They are, in their basic formula, Much Ado and the list of film and TV romances in that vein is endless because they will never stop using this 400-year-old formula.



Even more incredible and important, Shakespeare gave permission to writers to break our hearts before mending them. The comedies of ancient Greece and Rome never dealt in realistic heartbreak before getting the couples hitched. Yet Shakespeare does not flinch from real pain even in a comedy. I once had the privilege of seeing this play performed in a women's prison. These were women who knew what domestic violence is like first-hand and they were captivated by the story. The moment when Claudio rejects Hero was greeted with real emotion by an audience that would have been sure to scoff at a false moment poorly portrayed.

I believe you will be likewise captivated this night, under the stars.
